

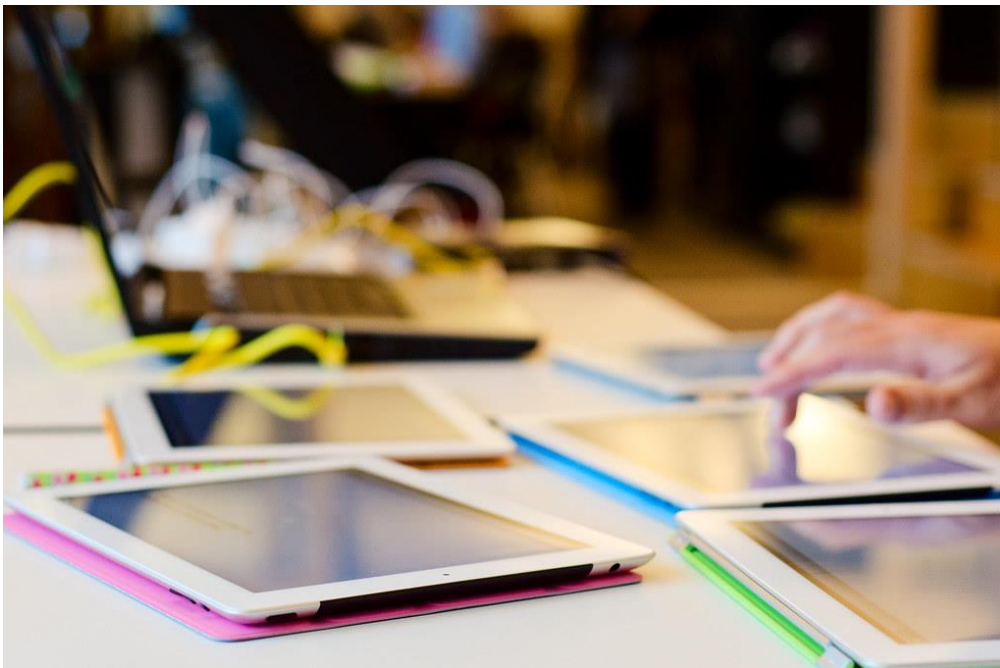

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Parent and Student iPad Management

Create your Apple ID when you set up your device:

1. Tap "Forgot password or don't have an Apple ID?"
2. Tap Create a Free Apple ID.



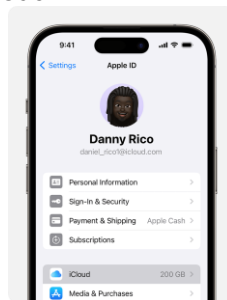
3. Select your birthday and enter your name. Tap Next.
4. Tap "Use your current email address" or tap "Get a free iCloud email address."
5. Follow the onscreen steps to verify your email address, create a strong password, set your device region, and set up two-factor authentication. If you choose to skip this step, you'll be prompted to do this later in Settings.

How to back up your iPad with iCloud:

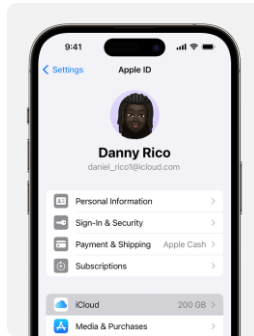
After you've backed up your iPhone or iPad, you'll have a copy of your information to use in case your device is ever replaced, lost or damaged. You can back up your device manually or turn on iCloud Backup to automatically keep your device backed up.

Back up manually:

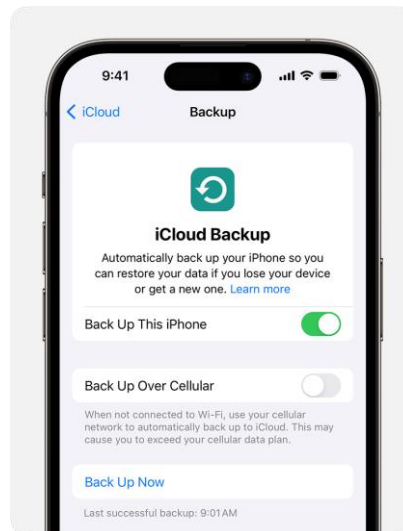
1. [Connect your device to a Wi-Fi network.](#)
2. Go to Settings > [your name] and tap iCloud.



3. Tap iCloud Backup.
4. Tap Back Up Now. Stay connected to your Wi-Fi network until the process has finished. Under Back Up Now, the date and time of your last backup will be displayed. If you receive an alert stating that you don't have enough iCloud storage space to complete the backup, follow the onscreen steps to [buy more iCloud storage.](#)



5. Tap iCloud Backup.
6. Tap Back Up Now. Stay connected to your Wi-Fi network until the process has finished. Under Back Up Now, the date and time of your last backup will be displayed. If you receive an alert stating that you don't have enough iCloud storage space to complete the backup, follow the onscreen steps to [buy more iCloud storage](#).



Automatically back up with iCloud Backup:

1. Go to Settings > [your name] > iCloud > iCloud Backup and make sure Back Up This [Device] is turned on.
2. Connect your device to a power source.
3. [Connect your device to a Wi-Fi network](#).
4. Make sure your device's screen is locked.
5. If you receive an alert stating that you don't have enough iCloud storage space to complete the backup, follow the onscreen steps to [buy more iCloud storage](#).

iCloud backups:

With a Wi-Fi network connection, you can back up your device using iCloud. You don't need to plug your device into a computer to back up with iCloud.

iCloud backups include all the information and settings stored on your device that don't already sync to iCloud. iCloud backups don't include:

- Data that you already store and sync in iCloud, such as Contacts, Calendars and Notes.
- Photos, if you turned on iCloud Photos.

- iMessages, text (SMS) and multimedia (MMS) messages, if you sync messages with iCloud.
- Data stored in other cloud services, like Gmail and Exchange mail.
- Apple Mail data.
- Apple Pay information and settings.
- Face ID or Touch ID settings.
- iCloud Music Library and App Store content.

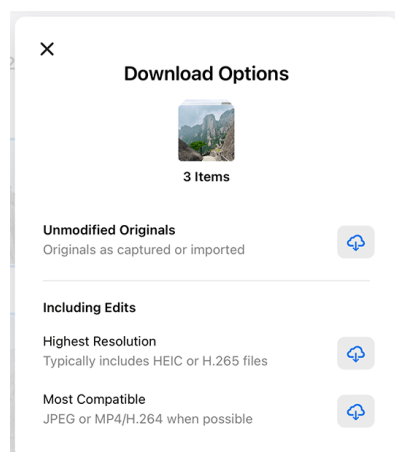
Download copies of your photos and videos:

When you turn on iCloud Photos, your photos and videos automatically upload to iCloud. They're not duplicated in your iCloud backup, so you should keep backup copies of your library. Use the steps below to download copies of your photos and videos to your Mac or PC. Or you can [import your library to your Mac or PC](#).

Download your photos and videos from iCloud.com:

1. On [iCloud.com](#), click Photos.
2. Select the photos and videos you want to download.
3. To download in the highest resolution, click the download button  in the top right-hand corner of the window. Or click the More button,  then click More Download Options.



- To download in the format most compatible for your device, JPEG or H.264, select Most Compatible. To download your content as it was originally captured or imported, select Unmodified Original.
4. Click download.

How to Download Photos from iCloud to iPad:

Depending on your need, **downloading all photos from iCloud** at once or downloading specific items, you will need different ways to get things done.

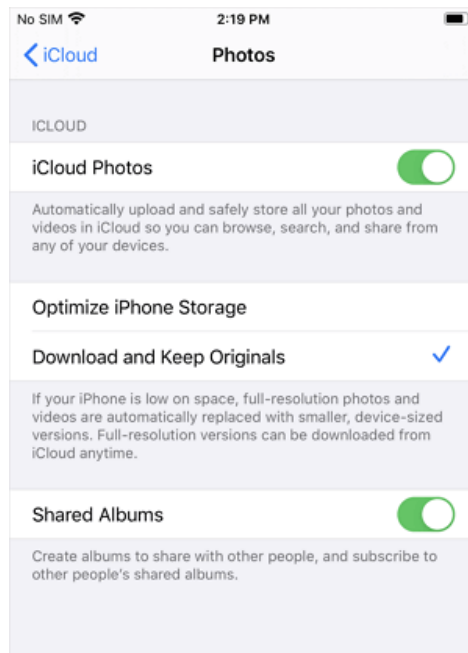
Method 1. Download iCloud Photos to iPad via Settings:

If you need to get iCloud photos on iPad all at once, turn on iCloud Photos (or iCloud Photo Library in earlier versions) on your iPad and select to download the original photos and videos to your iPad. Here are the detailed steps:

Step 1. Go to "Settings" > [your name].

Step 2. Tap "iCloud" and choose "Photos".

Step 3. Toggle on "iCloud Photos" and select "Download and Keep Originals".



Easy? With a few simple clicks, you can transfer iCloud photos to your iPad. Whenever you need to [transfer data from iCloud to iPhone](#) or iPad, you can follow the steps above.

Daily procedure to manage your child's iPad at home:

1. Sign into Apple ID on student device.
2. Create Apple ID if necessary.
3. Make sure all necessary data is synced to iCloud -

Photos, Videos, other Apple apps

4. Create a backup of student device.
5. Confirm data is backed up to iCloud by checking [iCloud](#).
6. Sign out of Apple ID.

iPad has been returned to parent & student:

1. Log back into Apple ID.
2. Set iCloud Photos to "Download and Keep Originals".
3. Photos will be present stored on iCloud to be re-downloaded as required.
4. Go to App Store & re-download chosen applications.

Find the app that you want to download, then tap the Download button.
